**At Girl Scouts of Kentuckiana, we open doors to possibility.**

2025 was a year defined by resilience, connection, and deepening growth. Because of the dedication of our volunteers, the generosity of our donors, and the commitment of our staff and community partners, girls across our region had the opportunity to discover who they are, who they can become, and how they belong.

Our retention and renewal rates remain among the highest in the nation. Every new and renewing family represents a girl stepping into a space where she belongs, builds confidence, and explores her potential.

**Every Girl Scout experience is a starting point for something bigger.**

From large-scale events to everyday troop moments, girls found opportunities to lead, create, and connect. Signature programs like Festival of the Arts once again brought thousands together to explore creativity and self-expression, while camp experiences across our properties offered space for adventure, independence, and lifelong memories.

In 2025, the impact of Girl Scouting was made possible through the generosity of our community. Donors contributed more than \$812,904 to directly support access and opportunity for girls and families across the 64 counties we serve in Kentucky and Southern Indiana.

- 4,600 Girl Scouts and volunteers accessed financial assistance, totaling \$179,000. This investment helps ensure that Girl Scouting is accessible to every girl who wants to participate, regardless of financial barriers.
- 281 girls were supported by \$55,690 in camp and outdoor leadership financial assistance.

**Our momentum is building.**

In 2025, nearly every nonprofit faced significant financial and operational headwinds, and we were no exception. However, with the characteristic spirit of Girl Scouts, our passionate members, volunteers and staff rose to the occasion to co-create solutions, together. We ended the financial year ahead of our projections. Looking to 2026, the council will continue to diversify revenue streams, optimize assets, and safeguard our mission for the future. The road ahead is full of partnership and possibility, and it's a future we're building together with you.

In 2025, we launched initiatives that will positively shape the future of our council. With expertise and influence from our dedicated volunteers, we set new strategic priorities to guide our organization for the next few years.

We are profoundly grateful to the champions who invest in girl leadership. It's our supporters and volunteers who ensure that future generations of girls will have access to membership and opportunities to develop their leadership, find their voice, take action, and make the world a better place.

With your support and the hard work of Girl Scouts, volunteers, and staff, we are building girls of courage, confidence, and character who will shape a brighter future for all of us.

## 2025 Camp Experiences


More than 2,200 Girl Scouts found adventure and new life skills in the great outdoors in 2025.

- More than 400 girls made lifelong memories during Overnight Camp.
- 275 Girl Scouts participated in Group Camping.
- Day Camps, led by treasured volunteers, welcomed more than 1,500 Girl Scouts.

## Bringing Girl Scouting to All Girls

Assistance funds often cover the costs for access to membership and programs.

- In 2025, 4,600 girls and volunteers accessed financial assistance, totaling nearly \$179,000.



38% of girls benefited from assistance, thanks to generous donors.

## Girl Leadership Experiences 2025

- More than 3,200 Girl Scouts actively participated in council-sponsored Girl Scout events.
- We held 69 council wide adventures in 2025.
- Additionally, volunteers organized hundreds of local service unit or troop-level programs across our council.

## Membership Growth in 2025

We continue to have a high retention rate that is among the top Girl Scout councils in the US. Families understand the value that comes with membership!

- 65% of Girl Scouts renewed membership.
- 7,400 girl and 4,770 adult members belonged at the close of 2025.

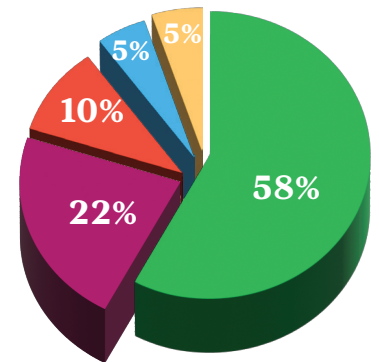

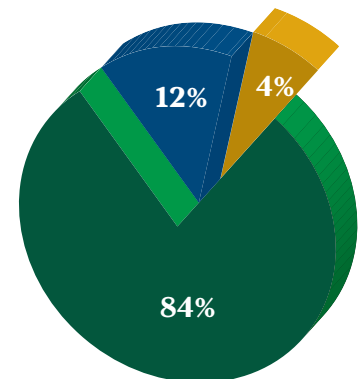

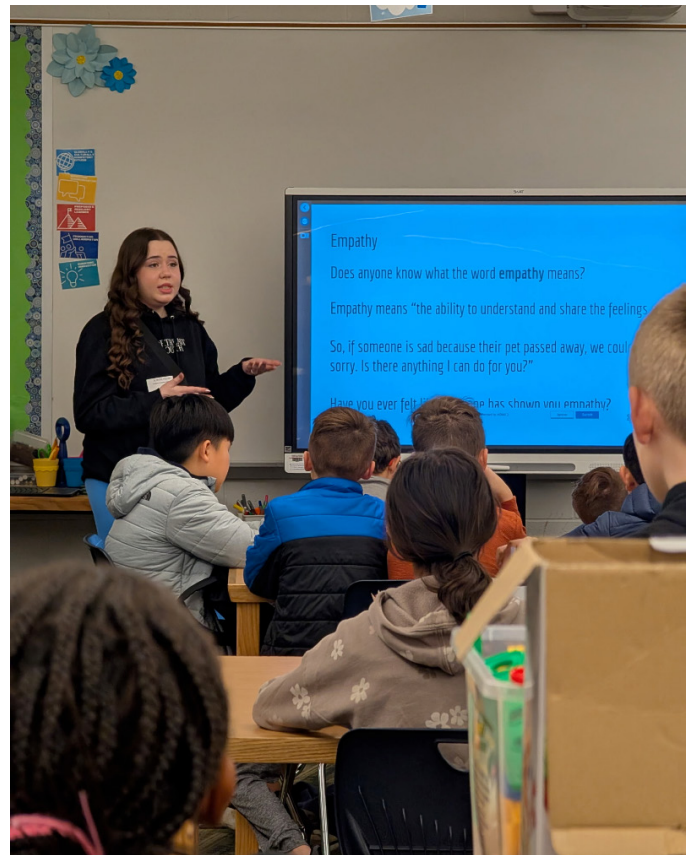


## Lily Bell

*Sack for Success*

Lily Bell wanted to help low income students have the necessary school supplies they need to be successful in school. She worked with a school in her local school district and got in contact with the Family Resource Coordinator (FRC). The FRC gave Lily a list of the most commonly needed school supplies that low income students need. This led her to create a curriculum that was taught to the schools BETA and Student Technology Leadership Program (STLP) students. The curriculum taught students about empathy, compassion, and how to plan for and execute a donation drive. After all of the lesson plans were taught, students made flyers and a donation box that was put in a designated spot in the school. The donation drive was successful and students were able to collect the school supplies and distributed these supplies to the FRC. The FRC then distributed all of these supplies to students in need.





### Amelie Johnson

*Ray Ready: Building a Sun-Safe Future*

Amelie Johnson focused on skin cancer awareness by teaching youth about sun safety and encouraging daily habits that protect their skin, like using sunscreen, wearing hats, and avoiding tanning beds. Amelie developed and assembled sun safety kits containing sunscreen and SPF lip balm. Over 300 of these kits were distributed at a Back-to-School Block Party, where she also shared printed educational materials on sun protection habits and early signs of skin cancer. Amelie hosted two community education days at local public pools. At these events, she distributed an additional 200+ sun safety kits and delivered interactive presentations. She also created an online platform designed to inform the public about sun safety practices and to dispel common myths related to skin cancer. Amelie shared her sun safety materials for ongoing use in local dermatology offices and on the Murray State University campus.

*Naturalization & US Citizenship*

Kate Solon planned and organized a naturalization ceremony on her school's campus serving 71 new citizens and guests in January 2025. She scheduled, planned, and led meetings with host and ceremony decisionmakers, including school officials, federal judges, and other personnel. Kate directed all event logistics including planning, coordinating the design of an event program, and leading the set-up crew in ceremony coordination. She also ensured that a naturalization ceremony will be held annually for the community at Sacred Heart Schools. Kate also created a resource to help others host a naturalization ceremony more easily. She increased civic education in the community as a result of the educational resource she created for her school and the Western District Court of Kentucky.



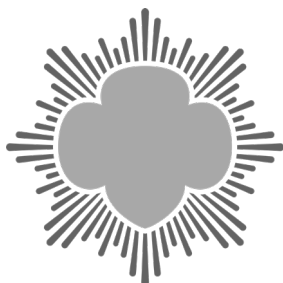

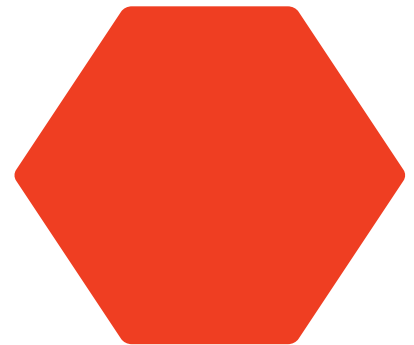
