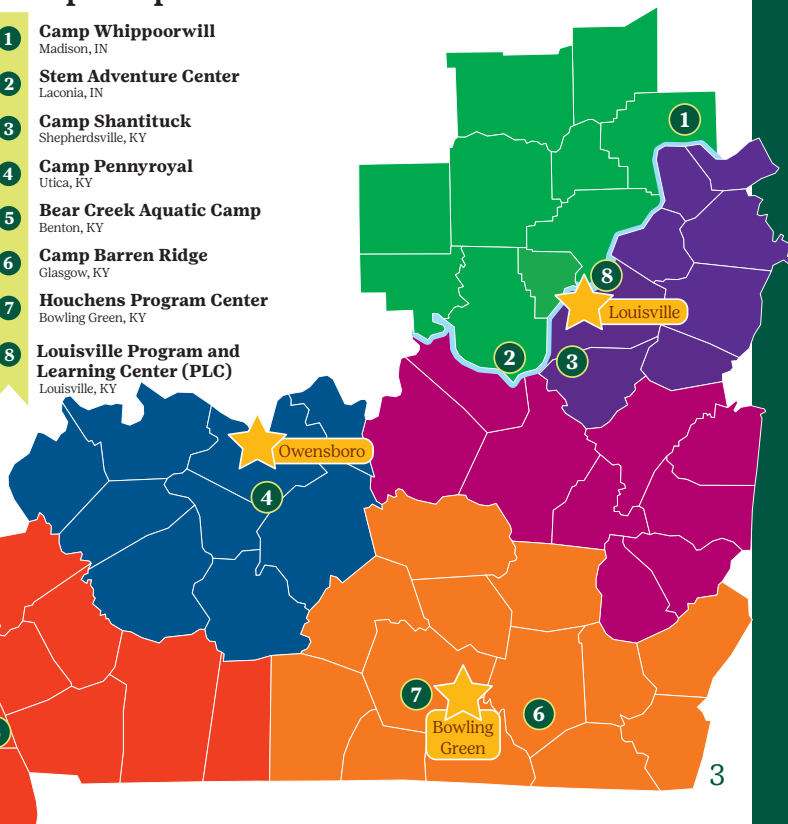

Sweet Dreams at Camp

Cozy up in our rustic sleeping quarters. Rising 2nd and 3rd grade campers will be assigned air-conditioned shared space cabins or bunk rooms. Rising 4th–12th grade campers will be assigned open air shared space cabins, shelters or platform tents with other campers in the same program unit. The counselors sleep in a separate cabin, tent, or space very close to, but not with campers. Decisions on what sleeping unit campers are placed in is based on age, attendance, camp session, and availability.

How to Register for Overnight and PLC Day Camp

Registration opens on **Cyber Monday, December 2, 2024 at 8 am Eastern**. The last day to register is **Friday, May 23, 2025**. Registrations are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Visit gskcamps.org and follow the link that takes you to CampDoc, our registration hub for all camper documents. Follow the prompts on CampDoc to complete registration. New to Girl Scouts? Annual membership can be added during the check-out process.

A non-refundable deposit of \$60 per Girl Scout is due when you register. All remaining balances must be paid by Friday, May 30, 2025. Registrants with unpaid balances after that day will be removed from the session roster, and their deposit will be forfeited. Payments toward camp can be made in full at any time prior to May 30 or can be paid via installments. We know things happen and plans can change, so families are able to cancel a reserved session for a refund (minus the \$60 deposit) before Friday, May 30, 2025. In case of camp cancellations by GSK, all payments will be refunded.

Sessions fill very quickly. When sessions reach capacity, campers can join the waitlist. If additional capacity becomes available, new openings are offered via email on a first-come, first-served basis from our waitlist. Hopeful campers on our waitlist will have five business days to respond to our email notice and pay the non-refundable \$60 deposit to claim the new spot.

After you register, you will soon receive a confirmation email directly from CampDoc, our camp registration platform. This email will contain important information to guide you through the next steps of completing your health profile, payments, and accessing a camper's Welcome Guide. If this email is not received within 24 hours, check your junk/spam folder, then please contact **Customer Care at 888-771-5170**. Our Customer Care team can also help you with any registration issues or questions.

Financial Assistance

Every Girl Scout should be able to make lasting memories at summer camp! Financial assistance is available to provide everyone with access to the same outdoor opportunities. In every instance the amount requested should reflect the true need of the family. Providing leadership opportunities through camp experiences is made possible by the Joyce Seymour Leadership Fund. Applications will open **November 18, 2024** with a deadline of **November 26, 2024 at 5 pm Eastern** to be pre-approved by Cyber Monday. All other applications must be received by **April 30, 2025**.

Earn Your Way to Camp

Campers can use previously earned Kentuckiana Credits to pay towards camp costs. Kentuckiana Credits may be used to pay a portion or the entirety of camp costs, but plan ahead: 2023–2024 Kentuckiana Credits expire on December 10, 2024. To apply Kentuckiana Credits to camp, use the form at bit.ly/kc24gsk.

Looking ahead, the Girl Scout Cookie Program is a great way for campers to earn a cost-free summer adventure. When a Girl Scout sells 2,200+ boxes, they earn a free week of Overnight or PLC Day Camp. Selling 2,600 boxes will allow you to bring a friend along with you during your free week!

If you have big cookie goals, reserve your camp spot early beginning December 2 using the code **COOKIE2025** to waive the \$60 deposit. If you don't quite make it to your goal, you can still use another form of payment to pay your full tuition. All payments will be due Friday, May 30, 2025.

Transportation Available for 2025

Transportation is available for Bear Creek Aquatic Camp and Camp Pennyroyal from Louisville and Beaver Dam. Campers travel in comfort on air-conditioned motor coach buses. Round-trip cost is \$150 and one-way is \$100. Bus transportation may be canceled if the required minimum number of riders is not reached. After May 23, the price shifts to \$200 for round-trip and \$150 for one-way and is subject to availability. Transportation requests after May 23, 2025 must be made 7 days or more before the start date of each camp session. Discounts are not available for transportation.

Including Every Girl Scout

Our goal is to provide a positive experience for all campers. Please help ensure your Girl Scout's successful camp experience. Contact us at least one month prior to the session to discuss any physical, behavioral, emotional, dietary, or other needs for your camper. Once we have reviewed your camper's needs, we will determine if we can safely accommodate those needs at camp.

We are inspired to provide communities of acceptance where you'll enjoy meeting new people from different backgrounds. At camp, we come together to challenge ourselves as we spend time in nature, try new things, and learn new skills. Our staff welcomes you to the magic of camp.

Health and Safety

The health and safety of our campers and staff is always a top priority. Trained first-aid staff are at camp sessions, and plans are established for medical intervention from local providers. To support campers' mental health, our camp programs are phone free. For public health concerns, camp sessions operate based on current recommendations from the Center for Disease Control, American Camp Association, and local government.

Learn about map reading and trip planning and take a trip on Kentucky Lake!

Off-Grid Adventurers

Rising 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th graders

Get off the grid and enjoy the outdoors with friends! Collaborate with other campers to plan a multiple night sleep-out camping adventure. You'll pick one of many options to travel to Land Between the Lakes—by canoe, kayak, or pontoon—and then explore a section of your choosing. Will you set up a base camp and go day-hiking or backpack part of the North-South trail? Will you try advanced campfire recipes or prepare lightweight backpacking meals? Will you sleep in a tent, hammock, or under the stars? Build your campcraft and survival skills and make forever-friends.

Rising 7th, 8th, and 9th graders

Bear Creek offers a huge variety of water sports—come sample them all! We have kayaks, traditional canoes, and stand-up paddleboards. You'll learn paddling skills to explore the entire shoreline of our beautiful bay. Begin learning how to harness the wind on fair-weather days to sail a windsurfer or sailboat. You'll also get to tour Kentucky Lake by pontoon boat, plan an overnight adventure, cook out a meal, play all-camp games, and bond with your camp besties.

Smooth Sailing Mariners

Rising 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th graders

This is the capstone program for sailors at Bear Creek Aquatic Camp. You'll refine your skills and advance your knowledge of rigging, knots, water safety, and boat rescues. You'll take day trips around the lake to develop teamwork with your crew, then study the weather and navigation charts of Kentucky Lake to plan an overnight sailing trip.

You'll learn about some of our native nocturnal animals and practice Leave-No-Trace principles to search for them at Bear Creek and Land Between the Lakes. Perhaps your group will plan to go stargazing in the meadow, take a night hike, sleep out under the stars, make up campfire stories, have a dance party in pajamas, or make a glow-in-the dark craft?

Perhaps you'll host an upcycled/recycled fashion show, lead a campfire storytelling session, write and perform a play, collaborate on an art installation for camp, paint a landscape, or sculpt local wildlife? Our well-stocked arts-and-crafts shed is at your disposal, plus the natural and recyclable materials you find around camp. Of course, you'll also enjoy cooling off in the lake, playing games, outdoor cooking, and planning an overnight adventure.

Rising 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th graders

Do you have the paddling bug? Come sharpen your nautical skills, improve your strokes, master wet exits, and begin learning to roll. When you've built strength and stamina, your group will venture out for a multiple-night trip on a water trail at Land Between the Lakes. Mariner Sailors are beginning-to-intermediate-level sailors. Master basic water safety skills, practice different kinds of rescues, and learn how to prevent heat and cold-related illnesses. Expand your vocabulary for hull and sail parts. Learn how to rig a sailboat, stow a line, use several nautical knots, and adjust the shape of your sail. In shore school, learn several ways to identify wind strength and direction.
